Previous venues include Wembley Stadium, The Emirates Stadium, Villa Park and St James' Park. Prizes include match tickets, signed shirts and balls, certificates and a host of other goodies. **There is even an extra-special prize for the overall winner and their school.**

At a time when racism is on the rise in society and far-right groups are actively recruiting young people, this competition presents a positive and engaging follow-on activity to classroom work on racism and citizenship. RULES

- Register your school by filling in the slip or e-mail gav@theredcard.org, no later than **2nd March 2012**
- Registration is free.
- The competition is designed to be a great follow-on activity to working with SRtRC educational resources in the classroom. However, if you have already ordered copies of any of our films and education packs, including Show Racism the Red Card, Islamophobia or A Safe Place, there is no need to buy a new copy to take part.
- Young people are free to produce work with an anti-racism theme in any medium. The categories are artwork, creative writing, film and music. All work is welcome!
 - * The maximum size of artwork must not exceed A3 (297mm x 420mm)
 - ** Film entries must not exceed 15mins in length. Film entries must be playable in Windows Media Player or on a standard DVD player.
- Schools must send in no more than one entry per category, per school.

The categories are:

- Year 1-4 Artwork and Creative Writing
 - Year 5-6 Artwork
 - Year 5-6 Creative Writing
 - Year 7-9 Artwork
 - Year 7-9 Creative Writing
 - Year 10+ Artwork & Creative Writing
 - Special Educational Needs Artwork & Creative Writing
 - All Ages & Abilities Multi-Media (this category includes all film, animation, drama, dance, PowerPoint, music entries etc.)
- Send your school's entry in each category you want to enter to SRtRC by **23rd March 2012**.
 - Please supply the following information on the reverse of each entry:
 - Name of Entrant
 - Year Group
 - Name of School
 - Number of participants in school
 - If you want to take part in Scotland or in Wales, separate competitions operate in these countries. Please see www.theredcardscotland and www.theredcardwales.org as applicable.
 - An independent panel of judges will pick the winners and SRtRC will organise an awards ceremony to present winners with their prizes. Winners will be notified in April 2012.
 - SRtRC pay travel expenses for winners to attend the awards ceremony
